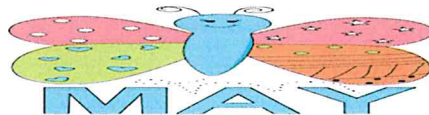

A look ahead in grade one:

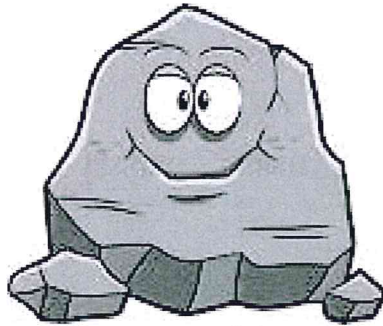

Grade 2 News...



Spring is a great time to be a 2nd grader! In March, we became scientists as we explored the world of rocks and minerals. All of our students had the chance to work with scientific tools to observe similarities and differences in both rocks and minerals. We learned many things about their different characteristics. We even learned about classifying rocks as sedimentary, igneous, or metamorphic.

At the end of our rocks and minerals unit, our scientific learning took flight into the world of butterflies! Our 2nd graders had the chance to learn about life cycles, and specifically how that term applies to a butterfly. This unit began with tiny baby caterpillars being delivered to our classrooms. The students monitored their growth and analyzed the daily changes that were taking place. They continued their observations right up to the amazing metamorphosis into butterflies! At the end of the unit, we released the butterflies into the wild. It was a little sad to see our friends go, but as soon as they started to fly into the breeze the students' sadness turned into cheers of excitement.

In May, we will turn our attention to preparing for our Sir Bookworm play. This is definitely one of the biggest highlights of the entire year. For the play, all of the students are assigned an important role. For many, this is their first time ever performing in front of a live audience. It takes a lot of practice, and hard work, but all of the students agree that it is worth it in the end. The Sir Bookworm Play is a day that they will never forget.

It is super exciting to be a 2nd grader in the Spring!



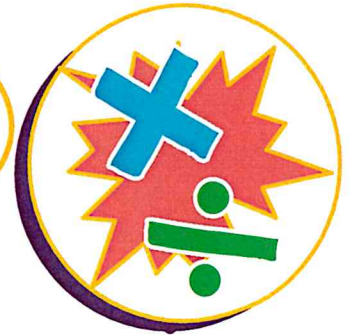
3rd Grade

FACT Frenzy

It was Fact Frenzy Month for third grade! Each third grade classroom engaged in a little fun, friendly competition together to see which class could master the most facts! The challenge was exciting and successful – with students cheering each other on throughout the event. After an intense month of practicing fact fluency, we're happy to announce that **we almost doubled the number of correct multiplication and division problems** throughout the third grade, in just four weeks! There was a **total of 110,767 correct problems** in multiplication and division from all the timings combined.

Why is the Fact Frenzy so important? We're glad you asked! Fact Frenzy is all about fact fluency, which refers to a student's ability to recall the basic facts in all four math operations quickly, accurately, and effortlessly. **Math facts are the building blocks for all higher learning math concepts.** A student's inability to recall basic facts significantly hinders their progress as future concepts are introduced. As a matter of fact, studies have shown that students experience less "math anxiety" overall when they have successfully mastered their basic facts.

Here in the third grade at WHEC, we are working to grow more successful, confident math learners!



Grade 4 News...



Water, Water, Everywhere!! The fourth grade students dove deeply into a science unit on water. They learned about the properties of water by doing investigations such as putting droplets on a penny to observe surface tension, creating a bottle straw system to show how water expands and contracts, and testing objects for density and buoyancy.

Students also learned about the water cycle, types of clouds, water pollution, and how to keep our water clean.

The final science unit will include learning about the skeletal and muscular systems. After learning about how the body works and how we can stay healthy, the students will participate in a fourth grade field day to put their bodies in motion.

In social studies, the fourth graders are starting to learn about the colonial period. Students will research what it was like to live in colonial times and will have a chance to participate in hands on activities which will include baking cornbread, weaving, playing colonial games, etc. In May, the students will visit the Daniel Boone Homestead as a culminating activity.
